

**Communication of the BIPT Council  
of 2 December 2024  
regarding the registration laid down in the NIS 2 Act<sup>1</sup>  
for entities already subject to notification in the  
electronic communications and postal sectors**

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<sup>1</sup> Act of 26 April 2024 laying down a framework for the cybersecurity of networks and information systems of general interest for public safety ("NIS 2 Act")

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## 1. Which entities must register with the BIPT ?

1. This communication is applicable to the following entities:
  - 1.1. Entities subject to a notification obligation laid down in Article 9 of the Act of 13 June 2005 on electronic communications (hereinafter the "ECA");
  - 1.2. Entities subject to a notification obligation laid down in Article 6/1 of the Act of 26 January 2018 on postal services as well as holders of a postal licence pursuant to Article 6 of the same Act.
2. This communication is not applicable to the following entities:
  - 2.1. Operators providing number-independent interpersonal communications services within the meaning of the ECA;
  - 2.2. Postal service providers which are not holders of a postal licence and do not provide parcel delivery services in Belgium.
3. **Attention:** Please note that electronic communications or postal service operators which are not subject to electronic notification with the BIPT must directly register on the <https://atwork.safeonweb.be/> platform, insofar as they are subject to the scope (for the postal sector - see below).
4. **Attention:** If you have already registered through the Safeonweb@work platform, it is not mandatory to submit the completed forms to us. However, all future updates will be sent via the form to the BIPT and no longer through the platform.

## 2. Registration obligation under NIS 2 via the BIPT

### 2.1. Procedure

5. Article 13 of the NIS 2 Act lays down a registration obligation. It is possible to check if you are subject to this obligation by using the tool<sup>2</sup> provided by the Centre for Cybersecurity Belgium (CCB). In case of doubt, you can contact the BIPT at the following address: [net.sec@bipt.be](mailto:net.sec@bipt.be).
6. Pursuant to the second paragraph of that Article, the entities referred to in the first paragraph must complete their notification with the BIPT, which provides a form to that end (form 1).
7. This form must be sent to the BIPT by **8 January 2025** at the latest.
8. This form must be filled in **digitally**.
9. If, for signature purposes, the form is printed and scanned, the unsigned digital version and the scanned signed version shall be sent to the BIPT.
10. The forms must be sent to [net.sec@bipt.be](mailto:net.sec@bipt.be).
11. The point of contact and the legal representative receive a confirmation if the registration is valid or, when appropriate, are notified that data are missing.

### 2.2. Communication of IP addresses

12. The NIS 2 Act lays down that IP addresses of essential and important entities must be communicated during the registration.
13. For electronic communications operators, this concerns public IPV4 and IPV6 addresses which are used within the framework of their own use of electronic communications services (corporate firewall, VPN, website...), de facto excluding IP ranges used for the provision of electronic communications services.

### 2.3. Registration of other sectors and other types of entities

14. If an entity referred to in paragraph 1 must register for other sectors or other types of entities from the digital infrastructure sector, it can use forms 2 and 3, which are respectively intended for entities not subject to the implementing act and those which are<sup>3</sup>.

### **3. Data processing**

#### **3.1. Registration for Services Provided by the CCB**

15. The registration data are at the disposal of the CCB.
16. The CCB will contact the points of contact by e-mail in order to invite them to register on the SafeonWeb@Work<sup>4</sup> platform to benefit from the services provided by Cert.be.

#### **3.2. Modification of Data**

17. In case of data changes, the entity sends the form back with the updated data according to the procedures described above.
